

SCHERTZ - CIBOLO - UNIVERSAL CITY ISD

BOND '26

Based on the recommendation of the district's Community Advisory Committee, the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City ISD Board of Trustees has called a three-proposition bond election. The \$295 million bond proposal includes upgrades and renovations to general facilities across the district, as well as improvements to stadium facilities and the purchase of technology devices.

2026 Bond Fact Sheet

What is in the 2026 May Bond proposal?



PROP A - GENERAL FACILITIES

Proposition A allocates **\$230.7 million** to support district-wide improvements such as campus security systems, classrooms and learning spaces, upgrades for fine arts and physical education, new play areas and campus refreshes at multiple grade levels. It also addresses HVAC replacements, roofing and building repairs, drainage and paving improvements, transportation updates, technology infrastructure, and utility upgrades.



PROP B - STADIUM FACILITIES

Proposition B proposes a **\$55.3 million** investment for renovations to multiple district stadium facilities. At Lehnhoff Stadium, renovations are planned to expand seating capacity and enhance accessibility. The project also includes updates to safety and security features as well as the lighting, sound system, scoreboard, concessions, and restroom facilities. Additionally, this proposition includes replacing stadium artificial turf at Steele High School and installing new stadium artificial turf at Corbett Junior High.



PROP C - TECHNOLOGY DEVICES

Proposition C allocates **\$9.1 million** for technology replacement, specifically funding computers, iPads, and Chromebooks for both students and staff.

How will the election impact my taxes?

The \$295 million bond proposal in May of 2026 is **not anticipated to increase the 2026-2027 tax rate** and would address safety and security updates, renovations and upgrades to current facilities, infrastructure replacements, stadium renovations and technology devices.

Since 2020-2021, the SCUC ISD tax rate has decreased 33 cents. This change reflects intentional adjustments by the Board of Trustees along with tax rate compression from the State of Texas.

Where did this recommendation come from?

The Community Advisory Committee (CAC), comprising over 75 parents, community members, and staff from both high school feeder zones, presented its recommendations to the Board. Meeting eight times between September 10 and December 10, 2025, the committee reviewed data, heard staff presentations, and toured facilities. The Board of Trustees approved the CAC's recommendation and scheduled the election for May 2, 2026.

How do I take part in the election?

To participate in the May 2, 2026 bond election, you must be a resident of the district and registered to vote. **The deadline to register is April 2.** For information on how to register and to check your voting status, please visit the district's **SCUC Votes** page.
